#### Council Reorganization 2015

Newly elected Councilmembers Fish, Councilmember Man and re-elected Councilmember Sternquist took their Oath of Office as Councilmembers during the Regular City Council meeting of March 17. Councilmember Tom Chavez was appointed to the seat of Mayor and Councilmember Vincent Yu was appointed to the seat of Mayor Pro Tem for a year's term.

### **City Staff Emergency Operations Center Training**

Last month, City staff assigned to the City's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) attended training hosted by the Los Angeles County Office of Emergency Management (LA OEM). The course provided an overview of EOC Sections and functions (i.e., Management, Planning, Operations, Logistics, and Finance) for personnel who are assigned to an EOC. The next step for staff training will be to focus on specific positions and their roles and responsibilities within the City's EOC.

### **Arbor Day Celebration**

Over 200 boys and girls helped celebrate Arbor Day at Live Oak Park on March 11. Activities included learning about trees through West Coast Arborist, arts & crafts, and a scavenger hunt. The highlights of the event were the wood carving demonstrations and taking a ride up in the cherry picker. Green lunch bags were given out to all participants and were also treated to BBQ hot dogs.



### **Spring Break Camp**

Spring break is coming up and camp will be held at Live Oak Park for boys and girls grades K through 6 and grades 7 through 10. To accommodate all of the children in the area, there will be two sessions: March 23-April 3 and April 3-10. Activities planned include a trip to Magic Mountain.

### **Spring Fling**

This year's Spring Fling will be held Friday, March 27 at Live Oak Park for boys and girls ages, 10 to 14. Pre-sale tickets are on sale now for \$10 and \$15 at the door. Activities planned include activities outside on the tennis

courts and in the community center, there will be a DJ, mechanical bull, bubble ball raceway, laser tag, and an inflatable twister game.

### **Easter Egg Hunt and Pancake Breakfast**

The Easter Bunny will visit Live Oak Park for the Annual Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 4. Activities planned include a pancake breakfast, springtime crafts, face painting, petting zoo, street magic show and a candy hunt. The event will take place from 8:30 a.m. to 12 p.m. noon with the hunts beginning at 10 a.m. sharp! Hunts are grouped by ages 1 to 3, 4 to 5, 6 to 7 and 8 to 9. The event is free to the public except for the pancake breakfast. The cost of the breakfast is \$3 for adults/teens and \$2 for children under 12.

### **Winter Basketball**

Several champions were crowned in the City's Youth Basketball League at Temple City High School Gym on March 14. The "A", "B", and "C" championship games were very exciting with large crowds on hand. The Mini and Clinic Divisions continue with their league champions being crowned on March 21 and 28 at Oak Avenue Intermediate School Gym.
